



The rules and regulations that apply to new applicants for the summer/autumn 2026 WBYO

1. All summer 2026 WBYO applicants must be between 16 and 27 years old as of September 14, 2026.
2. All young music professionals born between 01 January 1999 and 31 December 2010 in the non-EU Western Balkans —Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia, and Serbia—and holding a high/advanced level of musical education are particularly invited to go through the application process for the WBYO Summer 2026 season.

Young musicians from other countries in the region, including Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece, Romania, Slovenia, as well as from the rest of the European Union, and also from other countries beyond, are also welcome to submit their applications to participate in the WBYO 2026.

3. The decision of the WBYO audition panel is final.
4. All candidates must compete yearly for a place in the Orchestra, even if they have previously participated.

However, musicians who have been former section leaders or were on the highly commended are automatically eligible to attend the orchestra project without sending video recordings.

Video recordings may be requested from all WBYO 2026 selected musicians for preparation purposes in the following steps.

5. All candidates must submit the application form and required video recording before the application deadline. Applications received after the deadline or without the video recording will not be considered.
6. Candidates may apply to audition from any Western Balkans country, if it's their country of birth, residence, or country of study/work.
7. As part of the audition process, WBYO seeks the finest young musicians in the Western Balkans and EU interested in working at the highest level of excellence and are committed to music and social engagement.

The mission of the Orchestra is to bring the most talented young musicians of the Western Balkans and EU together, uniting them under internationally renowned lecturers and conductors every time in an ensemble that transcends cultural, social, economic, religious and political boundaries, all in the common pursuit of musical excellence.



The highest standards are therefore critical to the further success of the WBYO, and the Orchestra seeks members who are committed to achieving such high standards.

8. WBYO is dedicated to supporting its musicians' professional education, cultural growth, and career opportunities. During the application process, applicants will briefly explain their interest in WBYO projects and what they hope to gain as orchestra members.

9. WBYO does not charge candidates for auditioning.

Disability Policy:

The Western Balkans Youth Orchestra welcomes applications from disabled young musicians who satisfy the usual criteria to audition.

A disabled musician who wins a place in the orchestra will not be omitted because of that disability. The orchestra will try its utmost to ensure that a disabled member can participate as much as possible in all its activities: participation in performances and social activities.

General information:

Candidates will be asked to play a prepared piece of their choosing (e.g., a movement from a concerto, sonata with or without piano, etc.) and ALL selected WBYO Summer 2026 Orchestral Extracts.

The application process includes the registration form and video recordings. Applicants must record a video of themselves playing the mandatory orchestral excerpts and their solo piece in SEVERAL TAKES.

The video cannot be from a performance or an older recording (no older than nine months from the application deadline). High-quality video is recommended, and performing with a pianist is encouraged.

The solo piece must not exceed 5 minutes. You may submit an excerpt from a longer piece. Please upload at least two video on YouTube. This is the only format that will be accepted. Ensure the setting is on 'unlisted' (not 'private' or 'public').

Flautists, you are also expected to play the piccolo at your audition if you want to perform with it in the orchestra.

Oboists, it is optional to audition on the English horn, but it increases your chances if you do. As for the tours, we will need musicians who can also cover the auxiliary instruments.

Clarinetists, please note that you must bring an auxiliary instrument, but please get only one! Playing an auxiliary instrument increases your chances. We will need musicians who can also play the auxiliary instruments for the tours.



Bassoonists, you may have difficulty bringing a contrabassoon to the auditions. Please let the panel know if you play it.

Percussionists will be asked to play a selection of prepared orchestral extracts (no solo piece needed).

Woodwind Players, you don't need to prepare a solo piece for your auxiliary instrument, just the orchestral excerpts (bass clarinet, Eb clarinet, piccolo, English horn, contrabassoon, etc.).

Auditions are organised per project to fill approximately up to 70 orchestra places.

The selection committee reserves the right to invite past or current WBYO participants without a video recording, since they have demonstrated a high level of preparation, musical engagement, and commitment to the orchestra in the previous projects.

However, the WBYO also has a reserve list of about 150 players, which we rely on heavily, and those selected for the reserve list have a good chance of getting asked to play in the orchestra at some point during the year. The experience of auditioning for the WBYO is widely regarded as invaluable preparation for future auditions with professional orchestras.

Successful candidates will become members of the summer 2026 WBYO. They will be invited to participate in the July/September 2026 orchestra residency and concert tour (Be embraced) in the Western Balkans, Germany, and Belgium. They can work with expert instrumental professors and perform in several concert halls in the Western Balkans region (or open air), and Germany (Aachen, Aub, Bayreuth, Dortmund, Essen, Oberhausen) and Belgium (Brussels).

Orchestra residency typically begins with an up two-week rehearsal period (From July 28th in Shkodra, Albania), when musicians work in tutti rehearsals and sectionals with the WBYO Tutors, followed by a concert tour. In addition to preparing repertoire for the forthcoming tour, the rehearsal period offers opportunities for chamber music, personal and career development, and other recreational and social activities to enable musicians to make the most of working in a multinational environment.

Conditions for musicians

Members of the WBYO will receive a daily allowance, announced after the completion of the selection process. Tuition and accommodation (including breakfast) are free of charge.

Travel costs to the first project location and from the final concert venue will be fully covered. Travel during the concert tour will be organized by orchestra bus.



Return travel after the final concert in Germany will be arranged as follows:

- By flight for participants residing outside Germany
- By bus or rail for participants residing in neighbouring countries

Tips for Auditions:

The key to a successful audition and WBYO membership is the thorough preparation of orchestral excerpts and scores. Make time for your extracts/part, listen to the piece if it is unfamiliar to you, and/or look at the score. You must play the extracts/orchestra scores accurately and sensitively to the context of the whole piece, paying particular attention to accurate rhythm, tempo, dynamics and tuning.

WBYO Data Protection

Declaration for Auditions:

We value protecting your data. Therefore, we would like to inform you about the personal data WBYO processes in connection with our audition process and for which purpose.

1. Your Data

To effectively hold auditions for membership to the WBYO, we will collect, process and store the following personal data for each candidate:

- Name
- Date of Birth
- Gender
- Citizenship
- Address (permanent and residence, e.g. due to studies)
- Email Address
- Mobile Phone Number
- Name of current college/music school/music faculty and teacher
- Short motivation: why do you apply for WBYO
- Link and download a copy of your audition video

Your data will be shared with the WBYO panel members or alumni tutors and with the WBYO Accelerando project partners, in whole or in part.

We will save your data for the year you apply and the following year. Furthermore, your data will continue to be saved for the legally required period to ensure our compliance with the law (usually seven years, or in some cases, due to requirements of some public funding bodies, ten years).

This data will be processed for the following purposes:

- To contact you,
- To organize the auditions as described on this website.



If you enter personal data on this website, you permit us to use the data for the above-mentioned purposes. Your data will be safely stored and not shared with third parties other than those listed above. The only exception is sharing with state authorities, should WBYO be legally obliged to do so.

We are not obligated to submit the data we request on our website. However, you cannot participate in WBYO's audition process if you do not submit the data.

By submitting your application via our online process, you agree to collect, process, store and share your data to the extent described above.

2. Legal Basis for Data Processing

The legal basis for processing your data is your application to audition for WBYO or is to be found in our legitimate interest according to the GDPR, which consists of achieving the goals listed in Item 1 above.

3. Transferring Your Data to Third Parties

To safely process your data on our website, we use programs and tools from third-party providers with whom we maintain contracts for data processing. This ensures that these third parties safeguard your data, according to the GDPR. This concerns the following suppliers:
